As a club we are affiliated with Swim England. They administer and govern all amateur aquatic sport in the England. Our affiliation with Swim England provides our liability insurance to operate our Water Polo sessions which is why we will register your child(ren) as Swim England members. It is our policy that for players under 16 we register a parent/guardian as a Swim England member also. Swim England membership fees will be collected separately from your normal monthly club membership fee when you join and then annually every January.

We are proud to have been granted Swim Mark Essential Club status, which is national recognition that clubs are providing a quality service for all members, which is recognised by Swim England. The club is reviewed annually to ensure we continue deserve that status.

While we hope your child(ren) will be happy and content at the club we do recognise that sometimes questions, concerns or issues may arise, so communication between yourself and club is vital.

How we communicate with you?

Our main methods of keeping you informed of the progress of the club is via our website and emails.

Coaching Issues

If you have a question regarding coaching, you should in the first instance approach your child's coach.

Do so at a time convenient to you both and please do not go on poolside and interrupt training sessions. The coaches will be happy to arrange a time before or after training to discuss any training issues.

If you have a question or concern regarding child welfare the club welfare officer should be informed.

Safeguarding

As a club we follow the Swim England safeguarding policy called Wavepower.

This is a set of principles and rules that guide us as club how we can support and protect all our members. If you want to have a look at Wavepower, it can be viewed and downloaded from the Swim England website.

Whilst we will do all we can to provide a safe and healthy club environment, it is important that if something or someone causes your child to be unhappy that you tell us. Please contact one of the club's welfare officers.

If you do not feel you can approach the coaches or the club's welfare officers there is a dedicated helpline for anyone wishing to raise a safeguarding or welfare concern directly to the Swim England called Swimline – 0808 100 4001.
